Understanding gender from God's perspective (Genesis 1:26-31; 2:4-8, 18-24)

Introduction

 "Anything you can do, I can do better. I can do anything better than you!"

I. The Completion of Creation including Humanity (Genesis 1:28-31)

- The key verse: Genesis 1.31
 - The meaning of 'everything'
 - Order in creation (Genesis 1:28-30 cf 1:3-5, 16-18)
 - Order amongst humanity (Genesis 2:7-22; 1 Timothy 2:13)
 - The understanding of "very good" (Psalm 19:1)

P1: As creator, God's authority over creation (including humanity) is good and final.

II. The Creation & Commissioning of Humanity (Genesis 1:26-29; 2:4-8, 18-24)

A. Creation

- God made humanity in His image (Genesis 1:26-27 cf James 3:9)
 - Humanity is 'formed' and given the breath of life (Genesis 2:7 cf Genesis 2:23)
- God blessed and commissioned humanity collectively (Genesis 1:28)
- God provided for humanity's needs (Genesis 1:29)

P2: As creator, God ascribes equal significance and value to both male & female.

B. Commission

- Men and women play different complementary roles to fulfil God's mandate (Genesis 1:28)
 - The meaning of 'helper' ('ēzer) (Genesis 2.18 cf Psalm 33:20, Psalm 70:5, Psalm 115:11, Psalm 121:1-2, Psalm 124:8, John 14:26)
- Men and women are uniquely suited to their roles (Genesis 2:19-23; 2:4-8)
- Men and women complement each other perfectly (Genesis 2:24)

P3: As creator, God assigns different (complementary) vocations to both male & female.

Conclusion

 Redemption in Christ removes the corruption (of the fall) and restores proper connections (among fallen people) (Ephesians 5.22-32)
